## **Holidays during Term Time**

Mawnan School has always placed great importance on regular attendance and its positive impact on students' academic progress and overall development. Consistent attendance is crucial to ensure that children receive the education they deserve and have the best opportunity to reach their full potential.

The school's policy regarding family holidays during term time is in line with the guidelines set by the Department for Education. We can only authorize absences in exceptional circumstances, such as family bereavement or illness. Absences for reasons such as family holidays, birthdays, or visiting relatives are considered unauthorised and may result in penalties from the local authority.

We strongly encourage you to plan family holidays during the designated school breaks to ensure your child does not miss out on valuable learning experiences.

We understand that there may be unique situations where taking a holiday during term time cannot be avoided. In such cases, we kindly request that you submit a 'request for leave during term time form' the school office, explaining the exceptional circumstances and providing any supporting documents. Please note that each request will be considered on an individual basis, and that absence for holidays during term time will only be granted in exceptional cases.

Your commitment to your child's education is greatly appreciated, and together, we can ensure their success.

#### **Breakfast Club from January 2024**

Breakfast Club takes place between 8:00 am and 8:40 am every day. Breakfast consists of orange or apple juice, choice of cereal, toast, a selection of fruit and yoghurt. Numbers are limited, so booking is essential. You can make a booking for the whole year, or if spaces allow, you can book for a 'one off' session.

- In an emergency, please **call** the school office by **no later than 4pm** the day before the breakfast is required. The cost is £3 per child per day. Payment is made via your child's ParentPay account.
