Mawnan School Garden

Our beautiful garden has sprung into life and we've all enjoyed exploring, watering and spotting the new plants this week.

After Easter, our gardening club will run on a WEDNESDAY from 3.15pm to 4.15pm for our **Year 2 children** and will run throughout the summer term. This cohort will continue to have gardening club when they are in Year 3 to enable them to see the fruits of their labour.

The children have a wonderful gardening programme ahead of them; here is what they'll be experiencing.

Spring - sow early seeds, chit potatoes, mulch beds, make willow climbing structures.



Early summer - learn to take a cutting, bring on seedlings, regular watering and weeding.

High summer - look after annual vegetables and flowers, hold after school produce sale, visit a local garden.

Autumn - Plant an acorn, seed collection, plant spring bulbs. Cut back growth and feed compost bins. Harvest autumn fruit and veg. Visit a local garden.

The Year 2 children have already started working with Zinnia and Lucy this week and have sown poppies, sunflowers, pumpkins, cabbages, potatoes, lettuce, spring onions, cucumbers and zinnia!

COVID-19 Update

We have had a big increase in the number of children testing positive for COVID-19 this week with clusters in both Pico and Fusion Class.

In school, if your child presents with COVID symptoms, we will ask for them to be taken home – in line with our COVID 19 risk assessment. If this is the case, please arrange for your child to have a PCR test and await the results before returning your child to school. Please do not send your child into school if they are unwell.

The guidance remains that you should stay at home and avoid contact with other people if you:

- have any of the main symptoms of COVID-19
- have tested positive for COVID-19


If you have COVID-19, you can infect other people for up to 10 days from when your symptoms start. Many people will no longer be infectious to others after 5 days.

You can do a rapid lateral flow test from 5 days after your symptoms started (or from the day you had the test if you do not

have symptoms) and another the next day.

If both tests are negative and you do not have a high temperature, you're less likely to pass COVID-19 to others and you can go back safely to your normal routine.

If your test result is positive on day 5, you can carry on doing rapid lateral flow tests every day until you get 2 negative test results in a row.

Attendance Reminder

We do understand there are times when children will need to be absent from school for a number of reasons. As a result, we will only consider authorising absences in the following instances:

- For sickness or ill health
- For COVID-19 isolation
- For medical consultant appointments which fall during school hours
- For religious or cultural observances
- For a family emergency

If your child is absent, please <u>phone</u> the school by 9:00am on the first day of absence and provide us with the reason for their absence. The school is obliged to keep a record of absences and these are recorded on your child's report. Unauthorised absence and persistent lateness must be reported to the Local Authority's Attendance and Welfare Officer for further support and action. Please do not send message via Class Dojo as they may be missed.

Reminder about Holidays during term time

There have been amendments to the Education Regulations (Pupil Registration 2006) act. These amendments remove reference to family holiday and extended leave as well as the statutory threshold of ten school days. The amendments make clear that head teachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Whilst we understand that some absences may include times when your child is ill or attending appointments, (preferably out of school time) it is important that we all work together to try to ensure that your child has the best possible chance of success whilst at school.

If you decide to still take your child out of school, without permission, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may refer the matter to Cornwall Council who may decide to take legal action against you. A penalty notice can be issued under Section 444A and 444B of the Education Act 1996. This carries a fine per child, per parent, of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the penalty notice may result in Court action. Persistent absences not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates Court, leading to fines up to £2,500 and / or custodial sentences. The Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to court.

Under current legislation parent/carers taking their child on an unauthorised holiday in term time could be subject to a fixed penalty fine. This is something we would like to avoid happening so please avoid booking holidays in term time. Thank you for your support and understanding.
