



We are very grateful to Year 6 for successfully supporting their special friends (our new Ladybirds) with their smooth transition into school.





#### Mawnan Fun Run

Our fantastic PTA will also be running stalls at this great family event.

All courses start and finish in Carwinion Playing Field. The route for the 5km and 10km races follows the road down into route to recurrence of the skin and 10km races rollows the road down into Mawnan Smith, turning left at the Red Lion, up Grove Hill past Durgan cross roads, through Trebah Gardens to Helford Passage turning, then returning through the village. The 5km route then returns to the playing field while the 10km route continues up Sampys Hill, turning left after the garage through Boskensoe and Tregarne to Penwarne before returning through the village and back to the playing field. Drink stations will be provided at Trebah Gardens & Penwarn

The 1 mile fun run follows the same route from the start, but turns off Grove Hill into Shute Hill, past the school and through Carwinion Lane to return to the playing field.

Refreshments and drinks, including a licensed bar, a barbecue and a cake stall will be provided afterwards along with music, stalls and plenty of entertainment so stay for a while and enjoy the fun!

# Ofcom Children and parents media use and attitudes report 2022

This report looks at media use, attitudes and understanding among children and young people aged 3-17. It includes findings on parents' views about their children's media use, and how parents of children and young people aged 3-17 monitor and manage their children's use.



Children and parents:

#### Ofcom findings include:

#### Online access and attitudes

- Nearly **all children** went online in 2021 (99%)
- the majority used a mobile phone (72%)



#### Online behaviours

- Using video-sharing platforms (VSPs) such as YouTube or TikTok was the most popular online activity among children aged 3-17
- 31% posted content they had made themselves, especially those aged 12-17
- YouTube was the most widely used by children, 89% used You Tube, compared to half using TikTok

#### Online profiles

- A majority of children under 13 had their own profile on at least one social media app or site
- 33% of parents of 5-7s said their child had a profile
- More than six in ten children aged 8-17 said they had more than one profile on some online apps and sites (62%); the most common reason, overall, was having one profile just for their parents, family or friends to see.
- Just four in ten parents of 3-17s knew the minimum age requirement for using most social media; 42% correctly said 13.
- Four in ten parents of 8-11-year-olds said they would allow their child to use social media (38%). Access and download the full report <a href="here">here</a>
