### Anti-Bullying Week – Monday 10th to Friday 14th November 2025

This year, Anti-Bullying Week takes place from **Monday 10th to Friday 14th November**.

The theme for 2025 is "**Power for Good**" a powerful reminder that each of us has the ability to make a positive difference, to speak up, to support others, and to help create a school environment where everyone feels safe and valued.



#### What the theme means

- It's about recognising that kindness, respect and inclusion are not just nice ideas, but active choices we each can make.
- It encourages pupils (and staff) to use their "power for good" —
  whether that is standing up if they see someone being unkind, offering
  support to a friend, or helping make our school a kinder place.

 It covers every setting: in the classroom, in the playground, online, at home — wherever we connect.

### Odd Socks Day – Monday 10th November

We will be kicking off the week with **Odd Socks** Day on **Monday 10th November**.

On this day, everyone is invited to wear odd socks (mismatched socks) as a fun way to celebrate what makes us all unique and different. It helps to start conversations about difference, being yourself and accepting others. It's simple, fun — and a reminder that our differences are something to be proud of.

Bullying affects children's wellbeing, their ability to learn and enjoy school, and their confidence to be themselves. By having a week focused on these issues, we help to create a safer, kinder and more inclusive school environment for everyone.

With the theme "Power for Good" we are emphasising that each of us has a role to play. Together, we can make a difference.


**Remembrance Day**

# Tax-Free Childcare and Childcare for Service children vouchers

We are finally up and running to enable families to pay for Breakfast Club and Wraparound with **Tax-Free Childcare and Childcare for Service children** youchers.

### **Breakfast Club and Wraparound**

Service children can use government schemes like **Tax-Free Childcare**: <a href="https://www.gov.uk/tax-free-childcare">https://www.gov.uk/tax-free-childcare</a> to help pay for afterschool and breakfast clubs.

There is also a specific scheme for service children called the **Childcare for Service children scheme**: <a href="https://www.gov.uk/guidance/childcare-for-service-children">https://www.gov.uk/guidance/childcare-for-service-children</a>

This allows you to set up a Tax-Free Childcare account for a child aged 4-11, who is living with the serving person, to claim a top-up on childcare costs.

### To use these schemes

- Set up a Tax-Free Childcare account: You'll need to create an account with HMRC for each child.
- Check your child's eligibility: The child must be between 4 and 11 years old and meet the other criteria for the service children scheme.
- **Top up your account:** You can add money to your Tax-Free Childcare account and HMRC will provide a 20% top-up.

### What can be covered

- After-school clubs
- Breakfast clubs
- Holiday clubs (not applicable at Mawnan)

The vouchers are paid by the employer to the parents who then transfer them over to the school's main bank account (please use your reference number) which we then credit against Breakfast Club.

For service children, Mawnan School wil create an invoice for you to pay and can then be submitted through the JPA system.
