## Key Stage 2 Candlelit Carols at St Mawnan Church

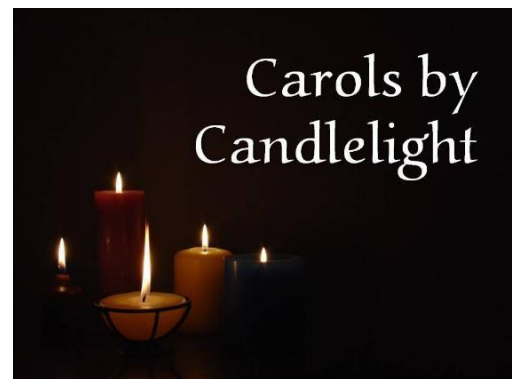
