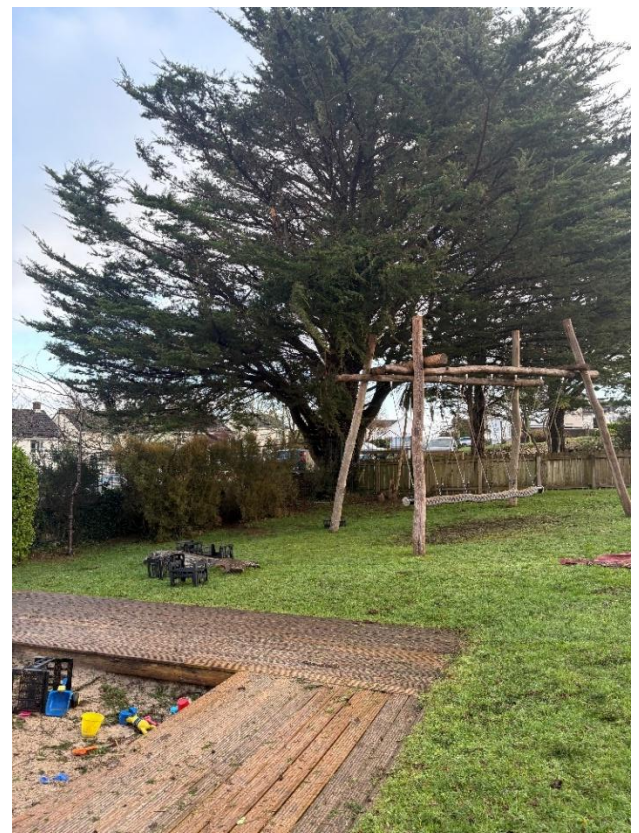

Trees

Thank you very much for the many kind offers of help as we repair the adventure playground following the recent storm. We are extremely grateful for your kind offers.

Like many of you, we are very saddened to be losing some of our mature, well-established trees, which play such an important role in our local environment. Work is nearly complete on removing the tree that fell in the middle of the adventure playground and we plan to use the logs to enhance our outdoor play provision.



However, it has also been confirmed that the large tree by the pedestrian gate will unfortunately need to be removed. The storm caused significant movement and damage to its root system, meaning it is no longer safe. This removal work will take place this weekend to minimise disruption to the school day and ensure everyone's safety. Work to rebuild the wall and fence will then follow over the coming weeks.

To help this work take place as smoothly and efficiently as possible, **we kindly ask that the parking bay outside the school is kept completely clear of cars throughout the weekend.** If you know of anyone who usually parks there at weekends, we would be very grateful if you could pass this message on.

This year, Children's Mental Health Week 2026 will take place from 9-15 February 2026!

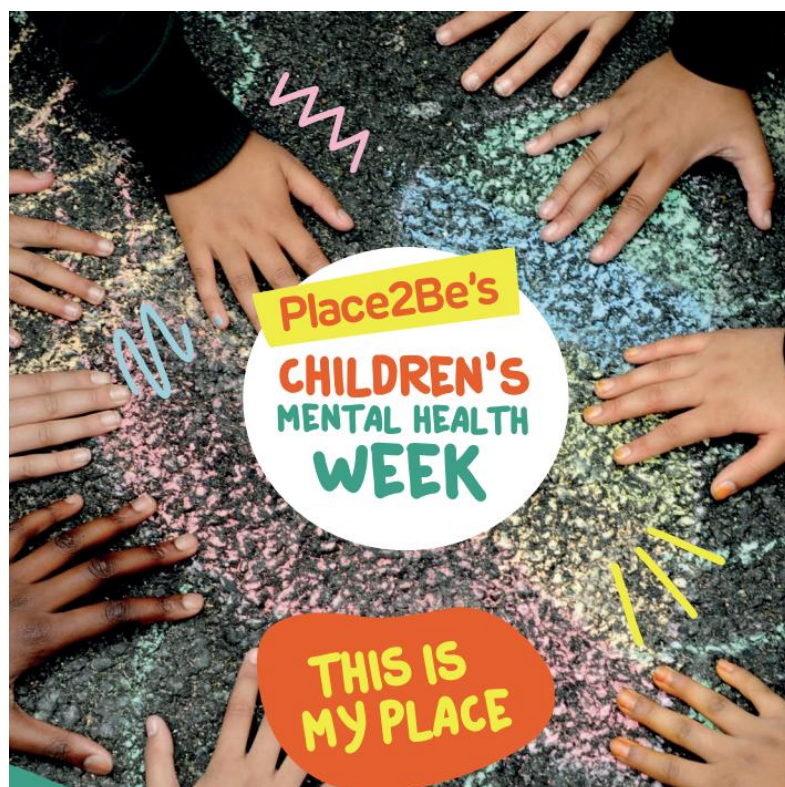

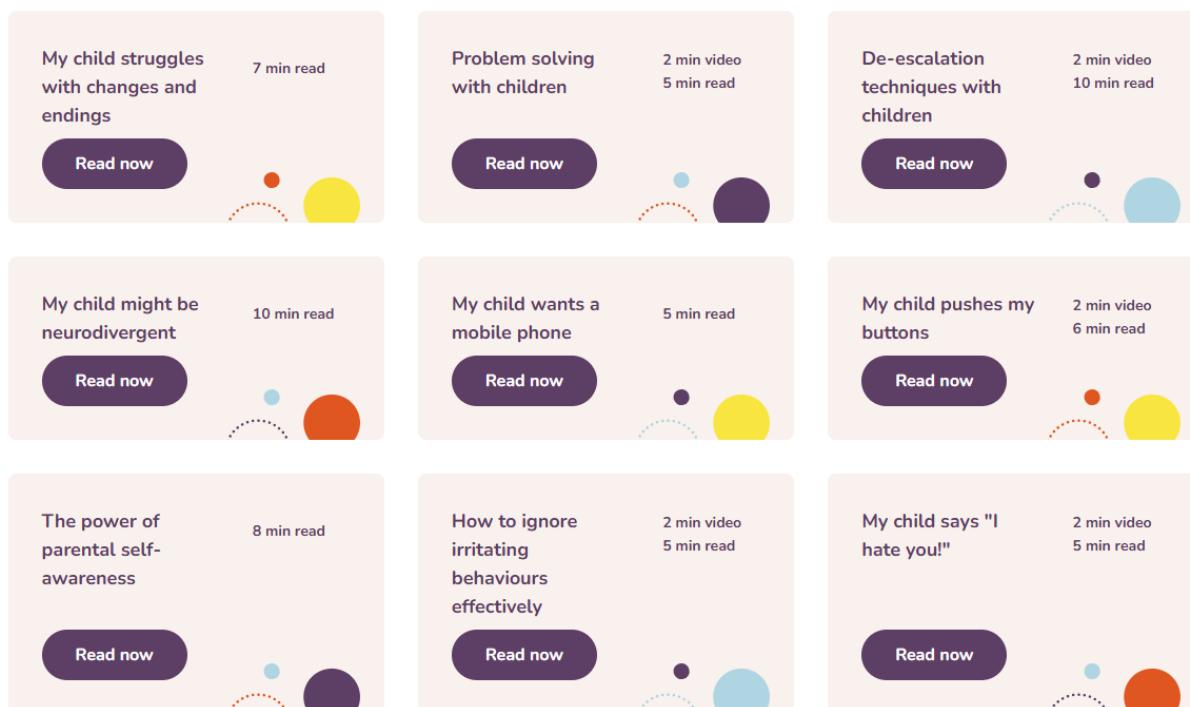
Cash donations will be greatly appreciated, and there will be a collection at the school gate.

Academy, trust and voluntary-aided schools set their own term dates and INSET days.

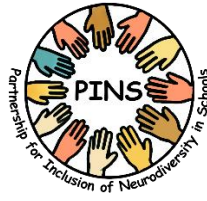
Our INSET Days for 2025-2026 are as follows:

Introducing the PINS Project

What is the PINS Project for?

This partnership work will give children, their families, and school staff the opportunity to have important discussions to understand how best to support neurodivergent children and their families within school communities across the country.

Parent Carers Cornwall, NHS Kernow, Cornwall Council and 30 participating school communities across Cornwall are working together to complete this important project work. The outcome of this local partnership work will be fed back into the national PINS programme for evaluation at the end of the project in March 2026

How will the PINS Project work?

Parent Carers Cornwall has appointed 3 PINS Locality Support Officers, who will be holding face to face and online parent carer engagement events for each participating school community. The community engagement opportunities will be informal and inclusive sessions, where parent carer views and experiences will be gathered. Parent carers will also have the opportunity to explore ideas that could create positive change within their school community, together with school staff.

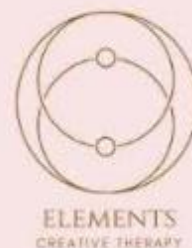
Nurturing Connections Workshop for Parents and Carers
