Wraparound Update

Thank you for taking the time to complete our recent wraparound care questionnaire. Your feedback has been invaluable in helping us review and develop our childcare provision for September 2026.

A significant number of parents told us that an earlier finish time of 5.15pm would have a negative impact on their working day. In response to this feedback, we have revised our plans and will continue to operate the club until 5.30pm.

From September 2026, the revised wraparound care offer will include:

- New operating hours: 3.15pm – 5.30pm
- Updated session costs: £6.00 until 4.15pm and £12.00 until 5.30pm
- Reduced operating days: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday (the club will be closed on Fridays)
- A "pay for place" model. This means that sessions booked until 5.30pm will be charged in full, regardless of whether your child attends from 3.15pm or joins after a school enrichment club at 4.15pm.

We appreciate your support and the constructive feedback provided through the consultation process. These changes will help us ensure that the provision remains sustainable while continuing to meet the needs of as many families as possible.

School Uniform Update


We have recently reviewed our school uniform policy in line with Department for Education guidance. As part of this review, we have reduced the number of Mawnan-branded items required from September to help ensure that our uniform remains affordable and accessible for all families.

The change relates to the lower part of the PE kit only. From September, children may wear plain navy shorts, skorts, tracksuit bottoms that are unbranded and do not carry the school logo. Tracksuit bottoms needs to be suitable for sports and not too baggy. Navy leggings can be worn under skorts during the colder months but not tights.

Our branded navy shorts, skorts and tracksuit bottoms will continue to be available through our uniform supplier. These items offer a smart appearance and are durable, high-quality options for families who wish to purchase them.

All other aspects of the school uniform and PE kit remain unchanged.

People's Emergency Briefing

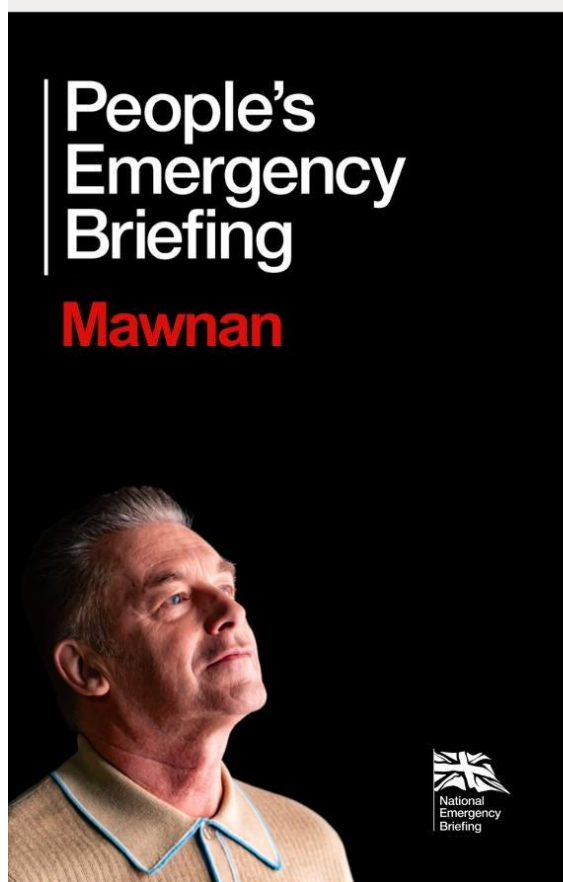
